


# HIGHLIGHTING LOCAL BUSINESSES



## HELPING SECURE SPACE FOR LOCAL AND RESILIENT ECONOMIES

If Mt. Baker Station area could transform into a market space that worked to highlight local businesses, how could this transaction of social and economic commerce assist local community efforts? Inspired by Beacon Hill's "Block Party at the Station," in addition to the Farmer's Market Coalition's definition of a "producer's only" market - in which vendors sell products they themselves have made - this project works to investigate what a "locals only" market model could look like. By enhancing the station space as an area for local businesses, restaurants, and organizations to gather, market, trade, and transact, the Mosaic Market concept aims to provide an event area for these groups to self-organize and connect.




## MT. BAKER STATION FIGURES
